




"Create an ambience that allows guests to interact in a unique atmosphere that is unlike what their day-today surroundings are."

If you're considering a backyard revamp, keep in mind that lead times for materials can be extensive. Charlotte Michaels, owner and founder of Transcend

Interiors in Reno, explains that even for outdoor furniture, lead times can reach three to five months.

"We're going through such a weird time in design and furniture because of COVID-19," she explains. "Suppliers are having trouble shipping things overseas, and there's a really big demand."

She notes, "If you're going to have a party in the fall and want to bring in new pieces, now is the time to order. "Even if the air conditioner seems OK, it's important to have an annual checkup, and better to schedule now so we can take a look toward the end of summer."

It's the same story with lead times for appliances, including everything from cooling units and furnaces to ovens and refrigerators. Steve Gunderson, kitchen designer for Czyz's Appliances in Reno, agrees that maintaining appliances is key right now.

"Make sure you're taking care of your outdoor and indoor appliances because there is not much available right now," Gunderson explains. "If someone comes asking for an outdoor refrigerator because they've neglected it this year, they're probably not going to get it until next year."





The housing market is hot

"Historically, July and August are our highest inventory months with the most transactions. Therefore, we might see a break in the housing shortage, but I'm not expecting it to be dramatic," exclaims Sam Olson, team lead/owner of The Olson Group of RE/MAX Gold in Reno. "We think it's because of 10 years of bad planning on the national level. The housing shortage is going to continue, and pricing will be very strong. It'll remain a very competitive market."

Olson urges homebuyers to be prepared to put their best foot forward, explaining that most offers are not receiving counteroffers from sellers. He adds, "Repair requests are almost nonexistent right now, but you should get inspections so you know what you're taking on. Don't fall in love with the house until it closes. You can like it, but don't start buying furniture. The third most common status right now is back on market."

For those looking to sell their homes who may not have air conditioning or flourishing outdoor spaces, Karen Walker Hill, residential specialist for Ferrari-Lund Real Estate in Reno, says the fall months are prime for putting it on the market.

"If you are holding off on selling your house because it's too hot in the summer and you don't have great shade, now's the time to start getting it ready," she notes. "Buyers will still be in abundance during the fall months, and that way you get your house on the market before the holidays."

While interest levels remain low, Shane Braninburg, mortgage consultant with Big Valley Mortgage in Reno, suggests looking into debt consolidation.

"With rates at historic lows and property values going up, it may make sense to refinance your home. There are many reasons, whether you are looking to lower your interest rate, shorten the term of your loan, lower your payment, renovate your home, or get cash out," he adds.


